- Hand written labels—requirements listed on “Using Chemicals in CALS Greenhouses Fact Sheet” located at <http://greenhouses.cals.cornell.edu/>

Sample Label (Required items in red)

ETHYL ALCOHOL 95%
DANGER! Flammable!

CAS#: 64-17-5

NFPA RATINGS (SCALE 0-4): Health=2 Fire=3
Reactivity=0

Statement of Hazards:

Causes respiratory tract, skin and eye irritation. May cause convulsions. May damage liver. May affect the central nervous system. May cause adverse reproductive effects. May damage lungs. Flammable liquid and vapor. May cause flash fire.

Precautionary Statements:

Keep away from all ignition sources. Avoid breathing vapor or mist. Avoid contact with eyes, skin and clothing. Keep container tightly closed. Wash thoroughly after handling. Use only with adequate ventilation.

First Aid:

Inhalation: Remove from exposure area to fresh air immediately. If breathing has stopped, perform artificial respiration. Keep person warm and at rest. Eye contact: Wash eyes immediately with large amounts of water or normal saline, occasionally lifting upper and lower lids, until no evidence of chemical remains (approximately 15-20 minutes). Get medical attention immediately.
